



Bearing Date the 26 day of 12 month anno 1684

Whereas There was a warrant granted to Thomas Hudson, to

take up several Thousands of acres of Land and the said note being regularly taken up but being unlocated by a pryar survey and the same having ben sold many times over to divers persons from one to another And Joseph Kirkbride having Bought five hundred acres of the said untaken up again and Jacob Taylor Surveyor General of this Province having sent an order to me to Lay out the said five hundred acres of Land in Bucks County Bearing dat the eightenth day of July 1722 to Joseph Kirkbride or his order and the said Kirkbride Requesting me to survey fower hundred acres to Joseph Worth of Honey Brook in Jersey now these may sartyfie that I have surveyd fower hundred acres in two tracts the first Lying in Buckingham Township Beginning at a Larg Black oak being the corner of Robert Smiths Land then north west two hundred and twelve perch to another black oak by Land formerly Layd out to one Edward West then north east by Vacant Land one hundred and sixty perches to a whit oak then by Land for a street or Road south east two hundred and twelve perches to another whit oak by Robert Smithes Land and by the said Smithes Land one hundred and sixty perches to the place of beginning Containing two hundred and twelve ^{acres} perches Acres.

the other beginneth at the corner of Samuel Bowns Land and Runeth by the said south west by west fower hundred perches to a whit oak then by William Clinkingburds Land north ten degrees east two hundred ^{and} twenty and fwer perches to a post then east two hundred twenty and two perch by Nicolas Penguits Land to a black oak stump then north by east west sixty eight perch to a black oak standing by Neshamony creek then down the several courses of the said to the place of beginning Containing two hundred and nine acres the whole containing fower hundred and some allowence for Roads and highways surveyd the 8 eight day of the 6 month in the yeare 1722
