



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Comm<sup>rs</sup> to me directed bearing date the 5<sup>th</sup> <sup>11<sup>th</sup></sup> 1702 to Resurvey all the Tracts or parcels of land within the County of Bucks which may be reasonably suspected to have been unduely surveyed (when first taken up) and have not yet been rectified, Resurveyed unto Christopher Weatherill a parcel of Land upon Neshameneh in Bucks County Beginning at a great white oak at the Mill Creek, Thence North by East 121 perches by John Swift and Samuel Allen's land to a Post, Then by Cuthbert & John Hayhurst's land East four degrees South 428 perches to a heap of stones by a great black oak, Then South by West 23 per: to a Spanish oak by Neshameneh; Then down the severall Courses thereof to Mill Creek, Then up the several courses of the said Mill Creek to the place of beginning Containing 236 acres Resurveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> <sup>19<sup>th</sup></sup> 1703.
