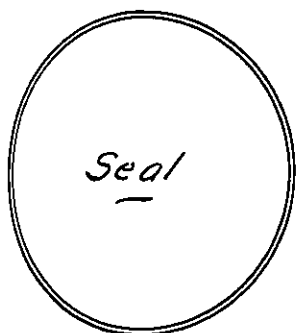

At the Request of Francis White Son of George White Original Purchaser of two thousand five hundred acres of Land in this Province That we would grant him to take up two hundred and fifty acres yet unlaidd out left him by the will of his s<sup>d</sup> father deceased. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out to the said Francis White the said Two hundred and fifty acres of Land that has not been already surveyd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians. And make Returns into the Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands & the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18<sup>th</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1703.
