These are therefore in ye Prop<sup>r</sup>s name to will and Require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyd ye said pece of Land unto ye said Willard, Certifieing ye the time when it was Laid out to ye said Hough, and make Returne thereof to ye Secretarys office Dated at Philadelphia the 6<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> mo 169<sup>1/2</sup>
