



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Commissioners to me directed beareing date the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1702 Surveyed and laid out unto William Croasdale a Tract of Land at Toque<sup>u</sup>minsey in Soulbury Township in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a Post in Stephen Beakes's line, Thence by the said Beakes's land N.W. 115 perches to a white oak at the Corner, Then N.E. by vacant Land 349 perches to a Post by a black oak marked W.C. Then S.E. by vacant 103 per. to a black oak at Rich: Burgesse's Corner, Then S. 17 per. to a small black oak, Then by Randal Spikeman's land S.W. 337 per. to the place of beginning Containing 250 acres and 63 perchs Surveyed the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month 1702
