



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property to me directed bearing date the 13th day of the 2^d month 1702 Resurveyed unto Enoch Yardley a Tract of Land in Makefield Township in the County of Bucks laid out to his father William Yardley for five hundred Acres, Beginning at an Elm Tree by Delaware River, being also Joseph Clowes' Corner, Thence W. 2 deg^s S. 856 perches to a black oak sapling, Then by vacant land N. 2 deg^s E. 104 perches to a post by a Chesnut Tree, Then by Reuben Pownell's Land E. 1 deg^s N. 768 perches to a white oak by the Meadow, Then S. 25 deg^s E. 12 1/2 perches to a Post, Then N. 74 deg^s E. 47 p. to a small Hickery by the said River, Then down the several Courses of the same to the first mentioned Elm Tree, being the place of beginning, Containing 518 Acres besides 2 Acres sold to Reuben Pownell not included in this Draught Resurveyed the 23^d day of the 9th month 1702.
