



By virtue of an order from Jacob Taylor for to survey unto Joseph Kirkbrid or his or to his order five hundred acres of Land in Bucks County being dat the eightenth day of July in the year one thousand seven hundred twenty and two and Joseph Kirkbrid having sold one of the aforesaid five hundred to John Chapman by virtue of a ded being dat the third day of Desember in the year one thousand seven hundred twenty and two Surveyd unto the said John Chapman the one hundre acres of Land Beginning at a whit oak being the cornear of Thomas Potters Land and then North West thirty five pearches to a black oak being the cornear of Jeramiahs Land then North East four hund eighty and four pearches by an old line of marked trees by Jeremiah Langhorns Land to a black oak for a cornear then South East thirty five pearches by Claypools Land to a Post then South west four hundred eighty and four pearches along a line of old marked trees by Thomas Potters Land to the place of beginning containing one hundred and five acres adjoining to Northhamton in Bucks county. It being part of Thomas Hudsons Right and having ben formerly surveyd by vertu of a warrant from the Propriator but being unlocated again by a pryer survey and the saime having ben conveyed divers times to divers persons as may more at Larg aper by the deds mayd for the saim Surveyd the fourth day of Desember in the yeare one thousand seven hundred and twenty two <sup>1722</sup>
