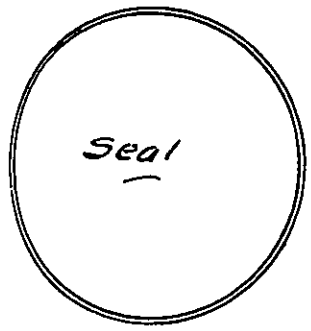

*William Penn Proprietary and Governour of the  
Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed*

*At the Request of William Cowper that I would grant him to  
take up five Hundred Acres of Land in this Province In right of Christopher  
Atkinson Purchaser in England: These are to will and require thee forth-  
with to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him the said W<sup>m</sup> Cowper,  
the said Number <sup>of Acres</sup> of Land not already taken up, according to the Method  
of Townships by me appointed. And make Returns thereof into my  
Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia  
the 17<sup>th</sup> day of the third Month A.D. 1700*

*To Edw<sup>d</sup> Penington Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Penn  
of the Province & Territories of  
Pensilvania*
