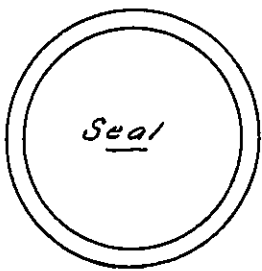

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in
Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed

At the Request of James Paxon That I would grant him a Re-
survey on a certain Tract of Land in the County of Bucks whereon he is
seated laid out for 300 Acres to John Heycock, two hundred and fifty
thereof being his first Purchase in England, and the other fifty upon Rent,
by the s^d Heycocks ~~with~~ Adm^r sold to Gilbert Wheeler, & by him to the s^d
James Paxon. These are to require thee forthwith to Resurvey or cause to be
resurveyd ~~and~~ the said Tract according to its first bounds and Lines of Survey
and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand
and Seal at Philadelphia the 24th of the first month 170⁹.
