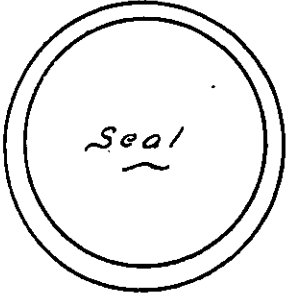

thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd ~~the~~ the said Tract  
according to its ~~the~~ boundaries and first Lines of Survey, and make  
exact Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand  
and Seal at Philadelphia the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> Month 1700*
