

Whereas there are two severall Tracts of Land part of my Manour, the one being pretended to be part of Southampton Towneshipe adjoining to the same and to Warmster Towneshipe, the other above potquersin Township to Southampton roade both in the County of philadelphia] by Thomas faireman Contrary to former Survey, and his returne Made in the Surveyor Generalls office, as also the Patent given by the Proprietary. yet the same Thomas faireman hath presumed to sell and dispose of Severall parcels of the said Manour unto John Jones &c. I do therefore Enter this as a Caveat in the Surveyors Generall office against any further procedures of Confirmation to be made to them or any other persons whatsoever, untill we have a full and cleare hearing before the Proprietary, about the same, Philadelphia, the 13th. of 9. mo. 1686. by me
