to take up five Hundred Acres of Land in right of Joseph  
Baines old Purchaser of ye Sd. Quantity ~ These are to  
require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd  
unto him the Said Number of Acres of Land that has not  
been yet taken up nor Survey'd, nor concealed, or cleared  
by the Indians, to be laid out according to the Method of  
Townships by me appointed, and make Returns thereof  
into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and  
Seal att Pensbury the 26<sup>th</sup>. day of the 6<sup>th</sup>. Month, 1700.  
To Edward Penington, Surveyor General.  
of the Province of Pensilvania & Territories.

If he can have 250 Acres in ye first township let him.
