

I do hereby Certifie That there is delivered into the General Surveyor's office the Return of the Resurvey of a Tract of Land Resurvey'd to Thomas ffairman by John Cutler the 25th day of the first month 1701^{1/2} by vertue of a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the Seal of the province bearing date the 21st of the 11^{mo} 1701 the said Return being Examined and Revised in the said office is as followeth

[videlicet] ^obid land scituate in Bensalem Township in the County of Bucks Beginning ^obi oak by a Rock upon the bank of Neshamenah Creek at the Corner of ^obid land from thence extending South 72 degrees westerly by the said ^obid land one hundred and sixty perches to a white oak thence south west ^obiive perches to a post from thence north north west by Tobias Dymock's ^obi four hundred and eighteen perches to a post thence in Joseph Growden's ^obi thence East north east by the said Growdon's land three hundred and thirty ^obid perches to a white oak fall at Samuel allens Corner thence south ^obid degrees westerly by the said Allen's land two hundred and seventy perches ^obi spanish oak thence south east by east one hundred sixty five perches to a maple by the said Neshamenah Creek thence down the same 59 perches to the place of beginning Containing Six hundred thirty six acres.
