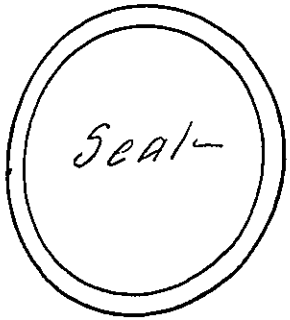


Pennsylvania.

Turner deceased and whose Rights the sd. John - Purchased or is otherwise lawfully Invested with the same. These are to require thee to Survey and lay out to the sd. John ffurnese in the new Township appropriated to Servants in the County of Philadia. the sd. quantity of three hundred & fifty Acres to be held under the yearly Rent aforesd and make Returns thereof into the Surveyors Office at Philadia. where this Warrant is to remain & a Copy thereof to be delvd^d to thee certified by ye Secretary, who is also to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his office.
