

Whereas by a Warrant from the Proprietary & Governr dated the 17th. of October 1701 there was Survey'd and laid out to William Parlet One hundred forty four acres of Land near Wrightstown in the County of Bucks and by a Warrant dated the first of the first month 1700, unto William Derrick One hundred forty eight acres Contiguous to the said Parlets Tract. The said Parcels taken together in One Tract [being both in the Possession of William Lacey Son in Law to the said Wm. Parlet] are Bound- ed as follows. Beginning at a Corner Post in Samuel Baker's line and Running by the same North East two hundred forty four pches to a Corner Black Oak Then by a Line of Marked trees North West One hundred ninety two pches to a post Then South West by a Line of Marked trees Two hundred forty four pches to a Corner Black Oak. Then South East by ~~a Line~~ by a Line of Marked trees One hundrd Ninety two per. to the place of Begin- ning Containing two hundred Ninety two acres.

Returned into the Secretary's Office the 28th. day of May Anno 1718.
