At the request of Jeremiah Langhorn That we would grant him to take up in this Province the quantity of two hundred & fifty acres of Land the Original purchase of Thomas Cobb made of the Proprietrs. by Deeds of Lease & Release dated ye 10th. & 11th. days of Octobr. Anno. 1681. The right to which by Sundry Mes-
sue Conveyances being now vested in the said Jeremiah. —

These are to authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Jeremiah Langhorn according to the Method of Townships appointed ye quantity of Two hundred & forty six acres [the Liberty Land being already laid out] that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor^{is} Seated by the Indians and make returns of ye Same into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said Jeremiah release and resigne a former Survey pretended to be made in the aforesaid Right, shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & ye lesser Seal of ye Province at Philada. ye 1st day of ye 6^{mo}. Anno Dni. 1720.
