



This Tract of Land above was surveyed to Jeremiah Langhorne By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of property Dated The twenty fourth Day of July in The year 1717 and By order from Jacob Taylor, Surveyed to Jeremiah Langhorne in Right of George Beale. Purcher of Three Thousand acres of William Penn. The above Tract of Land Beginning at a post standing in The county Line Between The County of Bucks and Philadelphia. Then Running north west along said County Line four hundred and forty perches To a Black oak Then North East one Hundred and seventy perches By vacant Land To a post Then south East By James Logans Land one hundred and forty perches to a white oak Then North East by The said Logane Land one hundred and Twenty perches to another white oak. Then South East By vacant Land Two hundred and ninety perch to a black oak Then South West By Jeremiahs- other Land Two hundred and ninety perch to the place of Beginning Containing Six Hundred and fifty acres with some allowance for High ways. Surveyed to Jeremiah Langhorn in the year one Thousand seven hundred and ninety.
