Trustees for the ffree Society of Traders Requesting me to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto Jeremia-Langhorn two thousand acres of Land part of twenty thousand acres purchased of the late Proprietary by the said Society This may certiefie that there was Survey'd and laid out in part thereof a Tract of Land in Durham^{TOWNSHIP} in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Black Oak on the West Side of Delaware - a little above the Mouth of Perelaken Creek from thence by a Line of Marked trees South sixty seven degrees West three hundred twenty eight perches Then North twenty three degrees West One thousand and sixty perches by a line Marked trees to a Corner Then North sixty seven degrees east by a line of Marked trees two hundred thirty six perches to^{A BLACK OAK ON} the bank of Delaware - Then down the same on several courses to the place of Beginning Containing One thousand and two hundred acres
