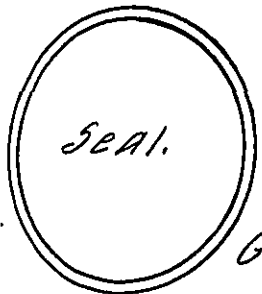


Pensylvania s.s.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Jeremiah Langhorne That we would Grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in Right of John Rowland and Priscilla his Wife and Thomas Rowland, first Purchassers of four Thousand two hundred ^{& fifty} Acres of Land in this Province to which the Said John Rowland hath since added by purchase of the Commissioners two Hundred and Eighteen Acres to Compleat the said five Hundred Acres Grant- ed to the Said Jeremiah Langhorn being the Remainder of all the Said Purchasses untaken up.

These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Jeremiah Langhorn According to the Method of Townships Appointed the said Quantity of five Hundred Acres of Land in the Said Province that hath not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretary's office in Order to a further Confirmation. Given under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia ye 13th day of the Sixth Month Anno Dni 1714.
