


Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of June anno Dom 1712 for Surveying to the assignees of John Decow one thousand acres of Land in Right of his father Isaac Decow's purchase of 2500 acres. Survey'd and Laid out the 10<sup>th</sup> of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month 1712 unto the said assignees viz<sup>t</sup>

200<sup>th</sup> Jeremiah Langhorn and John Chapman One Tract of Land near Page 112  
the Great Swamp in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a Hickory tree on the East side of a Small Run of Water Thence South by a Line of Marked trees two hundred and eighty pches to black Oak Then west by a line of Marked trees One hundred & fifteen perches to a white Oak Then by a line of Marked trees north two hundred and eighty perches to a white Oak Then East by a Line of Marked trees one hundred and fifteen perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred acres. Survey'd one Other Tract the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> Month Anno 1715 Lying on Scooks Creek in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a small black oak in a Line of the London Company's land Then by the said Line West three hundred and twenty perches to a heap of stones Then North by vacant Land One hundred and fifty perches to another heap of stones Then East three hundred and twenty pches to a white oak Then by the said Company's Land south One hundred and fifty perches to the place of Beginning Page 113

300 Containing Three hundred acres Also one other Tract Survey'd the 7<sup>th</sup> of the Second Month 1716 at Nickhomaxon in the County of Bucks Beginning at a hickory tree by the river Delaware and Running West by Samuel Barker's Land four hundred & eighty perches to a white Oak Then North Eighty pches to an Elm tree Then East by a Line of Marked trees three hundred and twenty pches to another Elm by Delaware River. Then down the same on the Courses thereof one hundred and eighty perches to the Place of Beginning
