

Pursuant to warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province bearing date the 21st 11 mo. 1701. Granting unto Joseph Growdon a Resurvey on Several Tracts of land scituate - Delaware River Poetquessink and Neshamink Creeks and the Eastern bounds of Southampton Township in the County of Bucks. the several Tract together making about nine thousand and six hundred - beside a Tract now or late belonging to Samuel Allen.

There is Resurvey'd to the said Joseph Growdon a Tract of land called Bensalem Scituate in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a pine tree by the River Delaware being a Corner tree of William Albason and Joseph Satorthwaits land from thence Extending North north west the said land and by Jno. Gilbert's land 308 perches to a Spanish oak by Poetquessink Creek from the up the said Creek after the several Courses thereof Six hundred ^{and six} perches to a post at the Corner of Joseph Mirl's Land from thence by the said land South South east 658 perches to a Corner marked black oak by Delaware River from thence down the said River upon several Courses the several distances added together 473 perches to the place of - Containing one thousand three hundred and acres six acres Resurvey'd by Jⁿ Cutler the 27th 1 mo. 1701/2.
