

Pursuant to a warrant under hands of the Commissrs. of Property and the seal of the Province bearing ~~date~~ the 21<sup>st</sup>. day of the 11<sup>th</sup>. month 1701. Granting unto Joseph Growdon a Resurvey on Several Tracts of land scituate between Delaware River ~~and~~ Potquessink Creek Neshaminah Creek and the eastern bounds of Southampton Township in the ~~several~~ County of Bucks. the several Tracts mentioned in the said warrant amounting to 9632 acres. There is Resurvey'd unto Joseph Growdon a Tract of land called Bensalem in the County of Bucks beginning at a Pine tree by the River Delaware at the Corner of William Albason's and Joseph Satorthwaits Land from thence by the said Land and John Gilberts land north north west three hundred and eight perches to a spanish oak by Potquessink creek. Then up the said Creek on several Courses the several distances on the said courses added together five hund hundred eighty eight perches to a post at the Corner of Joseph Kirls land from thence South south east by the said land six hundred fifty eight perches to a Corner black oak by the said River from thence down the same on several Courses four hundred seventy three perches to the place of beginning Containing one thousand three hundred and six acres Resurvey'd the 27<sup>th</sup>. of the first month 1702. by John Cutler.
