



Whereas by a Resurvey made upon ye Land of Francis Walker and Dunk Williams on Neshaminyes Creek there was found to be in that tract nine hundred thirty two acres y^t w^{ch}. was held for four hundred and fifty acres whereby it appears there is four hundred Eighty two acres overplus y^t w^{ch}. overplus the Proprietary hath sold to John Gray als Tatham and that a Certain Knowledge may be had of ye bounds of ye said overplus in order to obey ye Proprietarys ordrs. to us wee doe therefore in ye Proprietarys name ~~to~~ will and Require thee forthwith to survey and ~~to~~ Lay out or Cause to be Survey'd and Lay'd out within ye said Tract, unto Francis Walker Two hundred Twenty five acres Contiguous to ^{his} house and Improvements, and Likewise unto Joseph Growdon who purchased ye Right of Dunk Williams two hundrd. twenty ffive acres. Contiguous to ye house and Improvements. he made thereon and within ye Lynes of that tract, he sold to John Gray als Tatham and make Returne hereoff to ye Secretarys Office both of ye two aforementioned Surveys and Likewise of ye true Courses of ye overplus. Dated at Philadelphia ye 26 day of ye 3^d. mo. 1688.
