



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietary's Commissioners to me directed bearing date the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> Month 1702. To survey and Lay out to Mary Hayworth, widow of James Hayworth a Tract of Vacant Land lying in Newtown in the County of Bucks between the land of Benjamin Roberts and Jonathan Elridge, In pursuance of an Agreement made by the Proprietary to the said James Hayworth at Twenty pounds for every hundred Acres and so proportionably, Surveyed and Laid out the said Tract, Beginning at a white oak at Jonathan Elridge's Corner by the Common, Thence by the said Elridge's Town Lott E. by S. 146 perches to a small Hickery, Then N. by E. 26 1/2 perches to a white Oak, Then by the said Elridge's Country Lott N. 21 degrs E. 454 perches to a red oak Then by vacant Land East 112 per to a black Oak At Robert Bond's Corner Then by the said Bond's line South 2 degrs. West 81 per to a Hickory: Then by Benjamin Roberts's Country Lott South 35 degrs. West 484 per. to a small Hickery by Land for a Road, Then by the said Roberts's Town Lott with the breadth of the Road W. by N. 150 per. to a heap of stones by the said Common, Then by the same N. by E. 28 per. to the beginning. Containing 278 acres. [four pole for a Road by the head of the Town Lotts being deducted] Surveyed the ninth day of the Ninth Month 1702. By me John Cutler.
