

whereas John Hall of the Township of Bristol in the County of Bucks has Purchased of James Allen John Allen & Charles Allen Eighty seven acres of Land in the said Township and of Ralph Boorn twenty nine acres Contiguous to the said Eighty seven acres which was also formerly part of the said Allen's Tract. The whole Tract Composed of both the said Parcels and Containing One hundred and sixteen acres is bounded as followeth.

Beginning at a Post by Delaware River at a Corner of Jacob Pellisons Land and running by the same North by East One hundred ~~eighty~~ seventy eight pches to a Black Oak Thence North forty nine degrees east ^{One hundred thirty nine} ~~hundred two~~ perches to a post by a white Oak Thence by Samuel Allens Land East by south sixteen perches to a white Oak East North East sixty five pches to a Black - On the south east side of the Green swamp Then by the Bounds of the swamp south west by south One hundred twenty four perches to a three forked Maple tree And from thence by the several Courses of the said Swamp One hundred fifty six perches to a Black Oak sapling by Hogs Run Then down the said Run on several Courses One hundred and nineteen perches to Delaware River Then down the same forty two pches to first mentioned post.
