At the request of Georg-Heathcott that I would grant him to take up two hundred acres of the Lands of Sepassy in ye County of Bucks These are to will & require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto him the said quantity of Lands next below the lands belonging to James Harrison & Phineas Pemberton on Delaware river being the upper or northern part of the said Sepassy Lands, allowing sixty or seaventy pole by the said river in breadth or front, & runing back as the other lines there. And if the said Georg-Heathcott shall rather chuse to have the said quantity below the river nearer Burlington then to cause to be surveyed the said quantity unto him. next unto Arthur Cooks lands, he seating the said lands according to regulation & make returne hereof into my Secretary's office. Given at New Castle this 8<sup>th</sup>. 6 mo. 1684.
