*At the Request of Richd. Hough of Bucks That I would grant  
him a Resurvey on a Tract of Land in the Said County formerly  
laid out to him for 250 Acres by virtue of the Commrs. Warrt. 1685  
in Right of his Purchase of 500 Acres of me in England. and  
is Situate between Henry Baker and my Mannor of Highlands.*

*Also that I would grant him a Resurvey on a Tract of ninety  
Acres adjoining on Wm. Beaks, Henry Marjoram & Andrew  
Ellot derived from Willm. Beaks first Purchaser. Also on a  
Tract of Meadow laid out for 25 Acres in a larger Tract of one  
hundred Acres to Tho. Hudson granted by my Commrs. and is  
Situate in my sd. Mannor of Highlands. These are to require  
thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be resurvey'd to the sd.*

*Richd. Hough the three said Tracts of Land according to their  
true boundaries and first lines of Survey and make Returns  
thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and  
Seal at Philadelphia the 8<sup>th</sup> of the 11<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1700.*
