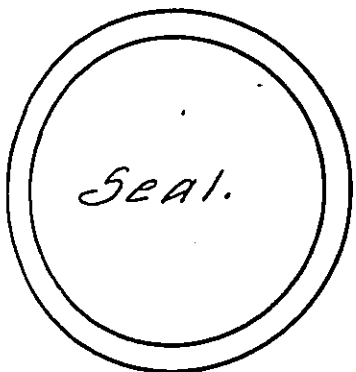


PENSILVANIA



William Penn Absolute Proprietary and  
Governor in Chief of the Province of Pensil-  
vania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Richard Hough That I would grant him to  
take up a vacant piece of Land, Situate in the County of Bucks,  
between the Lands of Robert Lucas and William Beaks and  
William Venables, containing about three Hundred Acres  
more or less. These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or  
cause to be Survey'd unto him the said Tract. and make re-  
turns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my  
Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 30<sup>th</sup> day of the ninth  
Month, 1700. Wm. Penn.

of the Province of Pensilvania and Territories.
