Number of Acres in ye aforementioned County & Place  
where not already taken up according to ye Method of Town-  
ships appointed by ye Proprietary & Governr. he seating  
& improving ye same w<sup>th</sup>in six Months from ye Date of  
Survey, & make returns thereof into ye Secretary's Office.  
Given at Philadelphia ye 12<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>br</sup> 1684.
