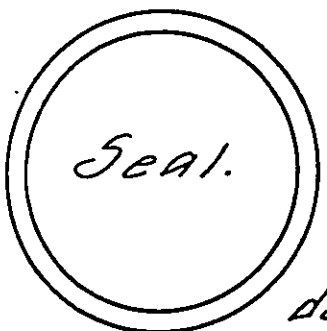


Pensilvania S. S.



By the Commissioners of Property.

Whereas is affirmed to us That Colonel Frederic de Redegeldt. Purchased lately of the Proprietary Ten thousand Acres of Land, <sup>in this Province</sup> which he granted to John Henry Kursten late of Langen, <sup>Salza</sup> in Thuringen. Seven hundred and fifty Acres to be laid out in the said Province between the Rivers Delaware and Sasquehannagh which ye sd. John hath requested us that he may take up. These are to Authorize thee to survey and lay out in part of the Purchase aforesd to the sd John Henry Kursten [to be held by him in case the Said Redegeldt's Purchase shall appear to have been really made] the Said quantity of Seven hundred & fifty Acres of Land [according to the Method of Townships appointed] that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians and make Returns into the general Surveyors Office at Philadia. where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadia. the 10<sup>th</sup> day of 10<sup>br</sup> 1705.
