By the Commissioners, of Property,

At the Request of James M<sup>th</sup> Veagh. That we would grant him One Hundred Acres of Land in that part of the County of Bucks called the Great Swamp without the Proprietor's Mannor Convenient for Building a Mill thereon, for which he has agreed to pay to the Proprietor's Use Fifteen Pounds next Fall and Interest after six Months after date hereof with the usual yearly Quitrent of one English Shilling for ever.

These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the Said James M<sup>th</sup> Veagh the said quantity of One Hundred Acres of Land where vacant in ye place aforesaid as conveniently as may be for the sd. Purpose being not already Survey'd nor Appropriated nor seated by the Indians. And make Return thereof into the Secretaries Office in order to a further Confirmation. Which Survey in case the sd. James fulfill the Agreement aforesd and build a Grist Mill thereon sufficient for the use of the Neighbourhood within Eighteen Months after ye date hereof shall be valid Otherwise the same is to be void & of no effect. As if it had never been made nor this Warrt ever Granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 7<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> Month A.D. 1719<sub>5</sub>
