At the Request of Hans Snyder now of German Town that we would Grant him to take up at or near Oley in this Province the quantity of Two hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> use four and Twenty Pounds Money of the S<sup>d</sup> Province for both and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres — These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Hans Snyder at or near the place aforesaid <sup>according to the Method of Townships</sup> the Said quantity of two hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into ~~into~~ the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the Said Hans fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof Shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 26<sup>th</sup> day of November Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1717
