



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property dated the 18th day of May 1715 Granted to William Cloud and by him Assigned to Joseph Cloud his son I ~~Survey~~ Surveyd to the sd Joseph Cloud a certain Tract of Land Situate on the North Side of a Mountain beyond the head of the western branch of Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester Beginning at a Chestnut Tree standing on a Rock on the East Side of a Small branch of Conestogoe thence East 160 pches to a black Oak by a Run thence North 212 pches to a Small Hickery thence West 160 pches to a Small White oak thence South 212 pches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred acres with the usual allowance of Six p. Cent
