

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 9<sup>th</sup> of 8<sup>br</sup> 1704. There was Surveyd and laid out unto Silas Crispin Executor of the Last will and Testam<sup>t</sup> of Thomas Holme five hundred acres of land <sup>in Philad County</sup> Remaining un- taken up of Eleven Thousand acres Purchased by the said Thomas. Beginning at a Black oak in the Line of Limbrik township Thence northwest by the said Line one hundred sixty seven perches to a Spanish oak in the Said Line Thence South west by John Tizacks land four hundred and Eighty perches to a sapling. Then by Jacob Pollasons land southeast one hundred sixty seven perches to a post Then by ~~vacant~~ vacant Land North east four hundred and Eighty perches to the Place of the Beginning west five hundred acres.
