

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 15th day of the 6th month 1700. I do hereby certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto John Carver his Plantation with the Lands adjoining scituate between the Lands of Job Howell, William Hibbs and John Hybert and Potquessin Creek in the County of Philadelphia reputed to be five hundred acres formerly laid out to him by virtue of the Proprietary and Governour's Warrant, but now found to contain five hundred and ninety acres. Beginning at a marked white oak standing by Potquessin Creek, from thence by the several Courses of the said Creek, the several distances on the said several Courses in all amounting to nine hundred and eighteen perches to a marked Spanish oak standing by the said Creek from thence West fifty two degrees South twenty one perches to a black oak from thence South forty two degrees West eighteen perches to a Red oak marked from thence South thirty five degrees West by an old Line of marked trees dividing this Tract from Job Howells Land one hundred ninety three perches to another old Line dividing it from William Hibbs's Land (where Note that the three last Courses according to old Patents should all run a South West Course, and also that ~~the~~ William Hibbs claims a Line that is later marked five perches short of the aforesaid division to be the true Line) from thence by the said old Line of marked trees South East by South one hundred fifty three perches to a marked black oak, from thence South thirty seven degrees East thirty five perches to a stake sett in the ground, from thence South thirty nine degrees East one hundred and twenty perches to a stake sett in the ground, no Line ~~appearing~~ appearing throughout the said distance, the said stake being a corner dividing it from other Land belonging to the said John Carver & the Land of John Hybert, from thence by a Line of marked trees East four degrees South four hundred and three perches to the first mentioned white oak. Resurveyed the 15th day of the 6th month 1701. and Returned according to the above said survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's Office the 11th day of the 6th month 1701.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty fourth day of June 1909.
