At the Request of Benjamin Chambers That I would grant him to
take up thirteen Acres of Liberty Land remaining due to him and Com-
pany, in right ~~of~~ of a purchase of five thousand Acres by them made,
Also that I would grant ^{it} ~~him the sd Number of acres~~ to be taken up adjoining
on the Northwest Side of his brother J^r Chambers's Land already taken up in
the Said Liberties, These are to require three to Survey or cause to be Surveyed
to him
the Said Number of Acres in the Said Liberties of the City of
Philadelphia adjoining to his Brothers Land as aforesaid, Pro-
vided it be not already taken up, and make Returns thereof into
my Secretaries Office, Given under my Hand and Seal at
Philad^a the first day of the 6th Month 1700.
