

Resurvey'd the 3<sup>d</sup> the 9<sup>th</sup> month 1703 unto Benjamin Chambers a Tract of land Situate in the Township of Blockley on the West side of Schuylkil Beginning at ~~the~~ a white oak at the Easternmost Corner of Thomas Pascals land Thence north west by the said Pascals land fifty three perches to a spanish oak Marked for a Corner Then by the sd Pascals land West one hundred twenty three perches to a spanish oak mark<sup>d</sup> for a Corner. Then north by the sd Pascals land one hundred forty eight perches to a white oak marked at the Corner of the land now belonging to the Widow James Thence by a line of marked trees and the said Widows land East two hundred and twenty four perches to a stake standing in a Corner of the said widow James land thence south by the Land of the said Widow James and the land of William Brown <sup>fifty three perches</sup> to a small black oak Then by the sd Browns land ~~East~~ <sup>East</sup> Eighty seven perches and a half to a small hickery sapling marked Then North forty one perches and a half by the said Browns land to a marked Black oak standing at the Westernmost Corner of the Land now belonging to Samuel Bradshaw Then by the Said Bradshaw's land south seventy two degrees east twenty three perches to a hickery stump standing at the Corner of John Garners land Thence by the said land south one hundred and eighteen perches to a small white oak sapling Thence East by the said Gardners land twenty seven perches to a Marked black oak Thence south seventy two degrees east by the said Gardners land one hundred sixty five perches to a Post standing by the west side of Beaver run Thence down the several Courses of the said Run thirty two perches to a hickery tree standing on the east land by the side of the said ~~land~~ Run Then through the Marsh and flats south south west fifty two perches to the River Schuylkil Then down the several Courses of the same two hundred thirty eight perches to a white oak by the said River being a Corner tree of land granted by patent to William Clayton Then by the sd land northwest one hundred and seventy four perches to the first mentioned white oak Containing Five hundred and forty five acres
