I hereby authorize thee to survey and sett out unto Benjamin East, John West & ~~Fairman~~ ~~Boyer~~ five hundred acres a peece up Taconey Creek next contiguous tott he five already seated here who had my order yesterday, John Bunce ~~two hundred~~ two hundred & fifty <sup>acres</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Campion four hundred ninety five <sup>acres</sup>, up Taconey Creek on both sides, if the place will bear it, & not to intrench on the Town bounds if so, then to keep to the northern side of the Creek, and to returne to me a true duplicate of the field work & protracted figures, which are to remain in my office, dated this 12<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>mo</sup> 1682.
