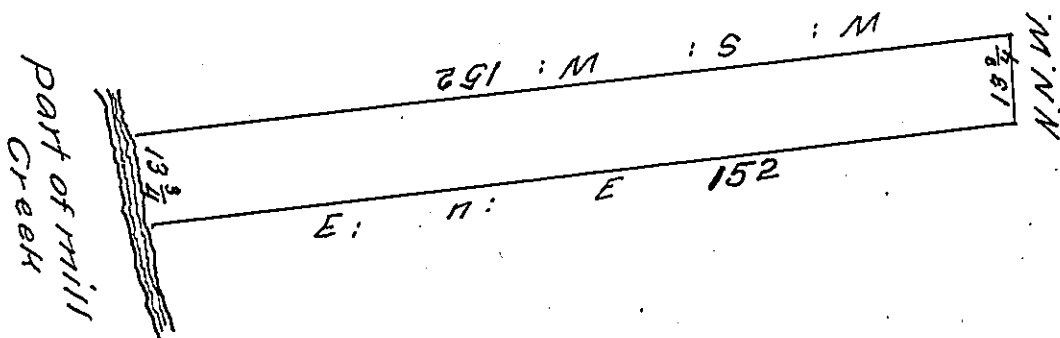

By vertue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Survey<sup>r</sup> Gen-  
 erall bearing date the 7<sup>th</sup> of the 6<sup>m</sup>: 1700: directed unto me  
 I hereby Certify into his Office that I have Surveyd and Laid out  
 the 9<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> same m<sup>o</sup>: unto Benjamin Chambers a Certain  
 peac of Land in the City Liberty beginning at a Stake hard  
 by a blak oak, marked by the mill Creek being <sup>being a</sup> Corner tree of John  
 Chambers Land from thence by a Line of marked trees East  
 north East one hundred and fifty two perches to a Stake sett in  
 the ground from thence north north west: therteen perches and  
 three quarters to another Stake Sett in the ground from  
 thence west South west one hundred and fifty two prches to a  
 whit oak marked by the Said Creek: from thence by y<sup>e</sup> said Creek  
 therteen prches and three quarters to the plac of begining  
 containing and Laid out for therteen acers of Land
