At the Request of Samuel Nichols of Philadelphia in behalf of Benjamin Clark that we would grant to the Said Benjamin to take up the proportion of Liberty Land belonging to the Original Purchase of five hundred acres ~~belonging~~ made by William Tanner of whom the said Benjamins father purchased the same; These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey and lay out to the said Benjamin the Said Proportion of Land within the Liberties of the City Philadelphia where not already taken up, if to be found vacant and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philadelphia where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be deliv^d to thee certified by the Secretary, Given under ~~my~~ ^{our} hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 16th of the 5th Month 1705.
