By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Peter Chamberlain of Warminster in this Province That we would grant him to take up a Lot of ground in the City of Philadelphia in Right of five hundred acres of Land purchased of the Prop<sup>r</sup> by Joseph Jones then of Southampton whose Right the Said Peter afterwards had Conveyd to him. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out or cause to be Surveyd and laid out unto the Said Peter Chamberlain in the back Streets of the Said City where Vacant one Lot of ground to be in breadth or front nine and forty foot & a half and the Same length of the adjacent Lots and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the Sixth Month Anno Domini 1789.
