At the Request of John Chandler of Philadelphia That we would Grant him to take up a Certain Vacant Lott on the South Side of Mulberry Street between the fourth and fifth Streets from Delaware in Philadelphia aforesaid (Bounded Northw^d with the sd Mulberry Street Eastw^d with another Lott of the said John Chandlers Southward with y^e ends of the High Street Lotts and westw^d with a Lott lately granted to William Sneed) for the term of Seven Years next ensuing after the first day of the first Month last past under the Yearly Rent of five English Silver Shillings or Value thereof in Coin Curt^t to be paid on the first day of first Month Yearly at Philadelphia during the term aforesd to the Propriet^r or his proper Officer These are to Authorize and Require thee forthwith to survey to the Said John Chandler the Said Lott bounded as aforesaid and Indorse a Return of the Said Survey or a Copy hereof to be deliv^d to the said John certified by the Secretary which Return shall be a Title to the Said John for the said Lott for y^e Term aforesaid he paying the ^{Rent} aforesaid every Year as the Same shall become due, or if the Said Rent shall be in arrears and unpaid during the ^{pace} ~~space~~ aforesaid of three Years then this Grant shall be Void and of no effect & ~~void~~ ~~being~~.
