At the Request of Sir Carver That I would grant him a Re-
survey on his Plantation with the Lands adjoyning Situate
between the Lands of Job Howel, Will^m Hibbs & John Hybert
and Potquessin Creek in y^e County of Philadelphia reputed to
be five hundred Acres formerly laid out to him by Virtue of
my Warrant. These are to require three forthwith to resur-
vey or cause to be resurveyed his Said Plantation and
Tract of Land accordind to the old and true Lines of the form-
er Survey ~~thereof~~ and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries
Office, Given under my Hand & Seal at Philadelphia
the fifteenth day of the 6th Month 1700.
