chase, he fencing y<sup>m</sup> in clearing y<sup>e</sup> land, & building up y<sup>e</sup> front Lotts w<sup>th</sup> in six Months from  
y<sup>e</sup> date of Survey & make Returns thereof into my Secretary's Office.*
