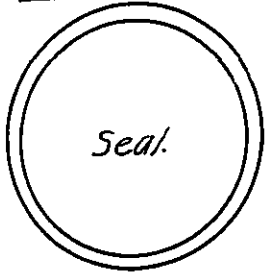


Pennsylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Henry ffunk Late of Germany but now of German town in this Province that We would Grant him to take up at or near the branches of Parqueoming Creek in the County of Philadelphia one hundred acres of Land for which He agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees Twenty Pounds Moⁿy of Pensilvania and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for the Same These are to authorise and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Henry ffunk at the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said one hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the Said Henry fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof Shall be valid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warr^t ever granted Given under our hands & y^e Seal of y^e Province at Philada y^e 20th day of 4th Anno Din 1718.
