Agreeable to Your Order of the Twenty first of March 1793 I have resurvey'd to Jacob Comly in right of Henry Comly's purchase of Five hundred acres of land of William Penn Proprietor. A lot of Ground in Philadelphia on the East side of the Second Street from Schuylkill Being Fifty five feet front on the said Second street and Two hundred forty seven feet six Inches deep between Walnut and George Streets in the said City — Bounded Westward by the said Second street Northwards by George Street, Eastward by Nº 1553 Of lots sold by the Honble Supreme Executive Council of Pennsylvania And Southward by a lot Occupied by William Eckhard as shewn by the draught —
