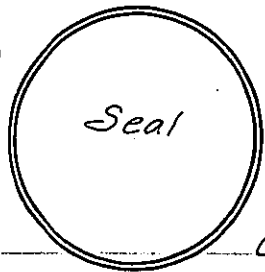

 nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated by the Indians to be held under
 ye yearly Quitrent of a half penny Sterl p Acre. And make
 Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where
 this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee
 certified by the Secretary, Given under our hands and the
 Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 10th of the 5th Moth 1704.
