


Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governor to me directed bearing date the 16th day of the 10th month 1700
I do hereby certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto John Powell a certain Tract of Land situate in the County of Philadelphia which had been laid out to his Father William Powell on the 7th day of the 5th month 1684 beginning at a Corner dividing it from John Roads's Land from thence by the said Roads's Line of marked trees West eight hundred and Six perches to a marked black oak sapling, from thence by an old Line of marked trees North Seventy eight perches to a marked Spanish Oak dividing it from William Smith's Land from thence by an old Line of marked trees East three degrees South five hundred and two perches, From thence (my Deputy David Powell finding no continuation of the said old Line followed the Course Specified in the Record of the former Survey viz.) East two hundred ninety and six perches to a Stake standing by the side of the River Skuykill the said Stake being placed about twenty foot distant from a old corner stump ^{formerly} dividing his and William Smith's Land & inclining towards the said Powell's Land from thence following the several Courses of the said River viz South twelve perches South twenty degrees East twenty four perches and South thirteen degrees East fifteen perches to the place of beginning containing two hundred ninety four acres and eighteen perches of Land, Resurveyed the 26th day of the 10th month and Returned according to the above said Survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governor's Secretary's Office the 28th day of the Said 10th Month 1700.
