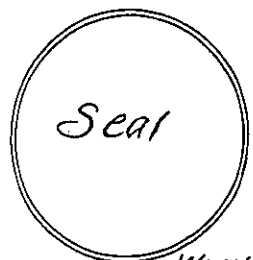


Pennsylvania ss.

 that We ^{would} grant him to take up one Hundred Acres of Land in the

 Eighty Pounds and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Starling forever.
 These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be
 Surveyd unto the Said David Potts within the Said Mann^r in a Regular
 Tract with as little damage as may be to the Remainder thereof the Said
 quantity of one Hundred Acres of Land and make a Return
 thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the Said
 David Potts fulfill the above agreem^t at Location Shall be valid
 otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made
 nor this Warr^t ever granted, Given under our hands and Seal of
 the Province at Philadelphia the 18th day of the 4^{mo} Anno Domini 1715
