At the Request of Joseph Paul That we would Grant him to take up four hundred and ninety two Acres of Land formerly granted to the Said Joseph by a Warr^I from ye former Commiss^{rs} dated 22^d of ye 12th Moth 1689 in right of Edw^d Blenman his Original Purchase of one thousand Acres ^{ch} Warr^I tis Said was never executed: These are to Authorize and Require Thee to survey and lay out to the S^d Joseph Paul in y^e right aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the S^d quantity of four hundred and ninety two Acres of Land in this Province where not already Surveyd nor taken up nor is concealed nor Seated to hold to him y^e S^d Joseph Paul his Heirs & Assigns in case y^e S^d Warr^I hath never been executed as is aforesaid by the Indians and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{la} where this Warr^I is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delvd to thee Certified by the Secretary.
